I. CALIBRATE - To standardize; bring into conformity with a standard by determining the deviation so as to ascertain the proper correction factors needed to adjust precisely for a particular function

## II. Recalibrating is about:

A. Standard - What is the standard?
B. Difference - How far am I off?
C. Conformity - What am I going to do about it?

## III. STANDARD - Jesus - How am I supposed to use my words?

## A. Matt 12:34-37-Productive

1. $\quad$ Abundance - perisseuma - A surplus or superabundance; Excess
2. Idle - argos - Inactive, unemployed; lazy, useless accomplishing nothing
3. Justified - dikaioo - To render just or innocent
4. Condemned - katadikazo - To judge against, pronounce guilty

## B. Matt 15:11,16-Peculiar

1. Defiles - koinoo -
a) To cause to be unclean or unacceptable to God
b) Common, ordinary, the generality as distinct from what is peculiar or special
(1) 1 Peter 2:9 - His own special (peculiar) people
2. STANDARD - Are words should be PRODUCTIVE and PECULIAR (UNCOMMON)

## IV. DIFFERENCE - Jeremiah - How am I currently using my words?

A. Jer 1:9-12 - Building and Destroying

1. Root out/pull down - To pull up by roots or tear down
2. Destroy/throw down - To break in pieces; To kill, cause to perish
3. Build/Plant - To build, construct, rebuild, plant, new growth
a) Prov 18:21 21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue, And those who love it will eat its fruit.
4. Eph 4:29-30 29 Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers.
a) Corrupt - sapros - Rotten, worthless, harmful
b) Edification - oikodome - The construction of something; process
(1) $\underline{\text { 1 Cor 14:3-4 }} 3$ But he who prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men. 4 He who speaks in a tongue edifies himself, but he who prophesies edifies the church.
B. DIFFERENCE - BUILD and TEAR DOWN according to GOD'S PLANS

## V. CONFORMITY - James - How can I change direction?

A. James 3:1-5 - Changing Direction

1. Stumble - ptaio - To trip, err, sin, fall, mistake
2. Bridle - chalinagogeo - To exercise close control over some function; self-control
a) James 1:26 26 If anyone among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless.
3. Bits or bridles - Used to direct a horse
4. Rutter of a ship - Used to direct or steer a ship
B. CONFORMITY - Change our WORDS - Change our DIRECTION
5. Joshua 1:8-9
6. Heb 11:3 - Frame our world with His words
