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## THE PURPOSE OF THE LOCAL CHURCH

The purpose of the local church is **not** to **ENTERTAIN** people, but to **ENTER-TRAIN**.

- To **ENTER** people into the fullness of Christ
- To **TRAIN** people as warrior disciples

It is **not** just about *coming* to church —  
it is about **BE-COMING** the Church as individuals.

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## LUKE 4: 14–15 (NKJV)

Then Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit to Galilee, and news of Him went out through all the surrounding region.  
And He taught in their synagogues, being glorified by all.

### Key Words

#### **Returned — *hupōstrēphō***

To go or come back to a place, condition, or activity where one has been before

#### **In**

A fixed position or location

#### **Power — *dunamis***

Force, miraculous power, ability to perform an activity

#### **Glorified — *dōxazō***

To speak of something as being unusually fine and deserving honor — to praise

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## LUKE 4: 16 (NKJV)

So He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. And as His custom was, He went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and stood up to read.

### Custom — *eiōtha*

An accepted or habitual practice of long standing

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## LUKE 4: 17–22 (NKJV)

And He was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah. And when He had opened the book, He found the place where it was written:

“The Spirit of the LORD is upon Me,  
Because He has anointed Me  
To preach the gospel to the poor;  
He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted,  
To proclaim liberty to the captives  
And recovery of sight to the blind,  
To set at liberty those who are oppressed,  
To proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD.”

Then He closed the book, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. And the eyes of all who were in the synagogue were fixed on Him.

And He began to say to them, “Today this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.”

So all bore witness to Him, and marveled at the gracious words which proceeded out of His mouth. And they said, “Is this not Joseph’s son?”

## Key Words

### Marveled — *thaumazō*

To be amazed, wonder, admire

### Gracious — *charis*

Kindness, appealing, pleasurable

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## LUKE 4: 23–31 (NKJV)

He said to them, “You will surely say this proverb to Me, ‘Physician, heal yourself! Whatever we have heard done in Capernaum, do also here in Your country.’”

Then He said, “Assuredly, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own country. But I tell you truly, many widows were in Israel in the days of Elijah...  
...and many lepers were in Israel in the time of Elisha the prophet, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian.”

So all those in the synagogue, when they heard these things, were filled with wrath, and rose up and thrust Him out of the city...

Then passing through the midst of them, He went His way.  
Then He went down to Capernaum, a city of Galilee, and was teaching them on the Sabbaths.

## Key Words

### Teaching — *didaskō*

To impart skills or knowledge; provide instruction; cause to learn

### Astonished — *ēkplēssō*

To be so amazed that you are overwhelmed; astounded; beside yourself; *shook*

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## LUKE 4: 32 (NKJV)

And they were astonished at His teaching, for His word was with authority.

### Authority — *ēxōusia*

Force, ability, jurisdiction, delegated influence

First the power or ability to do something, then the right and permission

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## MATTHEW 7: 29 (NKJV)

For He taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.

### Having — *ēchō*

To possess; to hold on to

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## LUKE 4: 33–35 (NKJV)

Now in the synagogue there was a man who had a spirit of an unclean demon...  
But Jesus rebuked him, saying, “Be quiet, and come out of him!”  
And when the demon had thrown him in their midst, it came out of him and did not hurt him.

## Key Words

### **Rebuked — *ěpitimaō***

To command, denounce, admonish

### **Thrown — *rhiptō***

To fling, toss, hurl; move violently

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## LUKE 4: 36–37 (NKJV)

Then they were all amazed...

“What a word this is! For with authority and power He commands the unclean spirits, and they come out.”

## Key Words

### **Amazed — *thambōs***

Unusual and sudden wonder

### **Commands — *ěpitassō***

To order, instruct, or direct with authority; right and jurisdiction to command

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## LUKE 4: 38–39 (NKJV)

So He stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her.

### **Rebuked — *ěpitimaō***

To command, denounce, admonish

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## LUKE 4: 40–41 (NKJV)

He laid His hands on every one of them and healed them...

And demons also came out of many...

## Key Words

### **Healed — *thěrapēuō***

To provide care to improve and recover health

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## LUKE 9: 1–2 (NKJV)

Then He called His twelve disciples together and gave them power and authority over all demons, and to cure diseases...  
He sent them to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick.

### **To Heal — *iaōmai***

To make a person whole; restore health

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## THE SAME SPIRIT — FOR US

**John 14: 17** — The Spirit dwells with you and will be in you  
**Luke 24: 49** — Endued with power from on high  
**Acts 1: 8** — You shall receive power  
**Romans 8: 11** — The Spirit who raised Jesus lives in you

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## LUKE 10: 1–9 (NKJV)

The Lord appointed seventy others...  
“Go... heal the sick there, and say to them, ‘The kingdom of God has come near to you.’”

### **Appointed — *anadēiknumi***

To assign a duty; designate or give a task

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## LUKE 10: 17–20 (NKJV)

“Lord, even the demons are subject to us in Your name.”

“Behold, I give you authority... over all the power of the enemy...”

### **Key Words**

#### **Authority — *ēxōusia***

Force, ability, jurisdiction, delegated influence

#### **Power — *dunamis***

Force, miraculous power, ability to perform an activity

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
