The Prophetic Accuracy of Jesus – Why You Can Trust God With Your Life

OVERVIEW

In this message, Chad Everett walks through Daniel 9 to reveal the prophetic accuracy of God's Word and why it matters for our lives today.

More than 2,500 years before Jesus came, God gave Daniel a precise timeline for the arrival of the Messiah. Down to the exact number of days, Scripture revealed when Jesus would come—and it happened exactly as God said.

This message is not just about prophecy—it is about trust.

If God was that accurate then, we can trust Him now.

Chad challenges us to move beyond opinions, distractions, and cultural influence, and instead anchor our lives fully in the Word of God. He reminds us that knowing Scripture is not enough—we must respond with surrendered hearts.

Because of this message:

- We are called to trust the accuracy of God's Word
 - We are called to know Scripture more than opinions
 - We are called to receive righteousness through Christ
 - We are called to make Jesus not just Rabbi—but Lord
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HOW TO USE THIS STUDY GUIDE

Read → Respond → Reflect

Open your Bible. Read the Scripture. Let the Word answer the questions.

The goal is not just understanding—but surrender and alignment with Jesus.

SECTION 1 — TRUST GOD’S WORD ABOVE EVERYTHING

Focus

Know God’s Word more than your own opinions.

Read

Daniel 9:20–23, Mark 13:7–8

Respond

1. In Daniel 9:20–23, what was Daniel doing when God gave him understanding, and what does that reveal about how we receive insight from God?
2. According to Mark 13:7–8, what are the things Jesus says “must happen,” and how should that shape a believer’s perspective on world events?
3. What do these passages show about the difference between God’s truth and human opinions?
4. Based on these Scriptures, why is it important to know God’s Word more than cultural or political viewpoints?
5. How can you intentionally build your life on Scripture rather than other voices?

Reflect

- What voices are shaping my thinking the most right now?
 - Do I know God’s Word better than I know opinions or current events?
 - Where do I need to realign my thinking with Scripture?
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SECTION 2 — GOD’S PROPHETIC PLAN (DANIEL 9)

Focus

God’s plan is precise and trustworthy.

Read

Daniel 9:24–25

Respond

1. According to Daniel 9:24, what did God determine for Israel and Jerusalem, and what does this reveal about His authority over time?
2. In Daniel 9:25, what marks the beginning and end of the prophetic timeline?

3. What do these verses show about God's ability to declare events before they happen?
4. How does this passage demonstrate that God's plans are intentional and precise?
5. Based on this, why can we trust God's timing in our own lives?

Reflect

- Do I truly trust the Bible as accurate and reliable?
 - How does fulfilled prophecy strengthen my faith?
 - Where do I need to trust God's plan instead of my own understanding?
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SECTION 3 — THE MESSIAH FULFILLED PROPHECY

Focus

Jesus came exactly when God said He would.

Read

Daniel 9:25–26

Respond

1. According to Daniel 9:25–26, what was supposed to happen when the timeline reached the Messiah?
2. What does this passage reveal about the certainty of God fulfilling His promises?
3. How does fulfilled prophecy strengthen confidence in the reliability of Scripture?
4. What does this teach us about God's control over history?
5. How should this truth affect the way we trust God with our future?

Reflect

- If God fulfilled this prophecy exactly, what does that mean for my life?
 - Do I trust God with the details of my future?
 - How should this increase my faith and confidence in Him?
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SECTION 4 — THE MESSIAH WAS CUT OFF (NOT FOR HIMSELF)

Focus

Jesus did not die for Himself—He died for us.

Read

Daniel 9:26, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Ephesians 2:4–9

Respond

1. In Daniel 9:26, what does it mean that the Messiah would be “cut off”?
2. According to 2 Corinthians 5:21, what did Jesus become for us, and why was that necessary?
3. In Ephesians 2:4–9, how does Scripture describe salvation?
4. What do these passages reveal about the difference between earning righteousness and receiving it?
5. Based on Scripture, why is it impossible to become righteous apart from Christ?

Reflect

- Have I been trying to earn what God has already given?
 - Do I truly understand that salvation is a gift?
 - Where do I need to stop striving and start receiving by faith?
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SECTION 5 — RECOGNIZING JESUS (RABBI OR LORD)

Focus

Jesus must be more than teacher—He must be Lord.

Read

John 11:25–26, Matthew 7:21–23

Respond

1. In John 11:25–26, what does Jesus say about who He is, and what does He ask in response?
2. According to Matthew 7:21–23, what is the difference between knowing about Jesus and truly knowing Him?
3. What do these passages reveal about what it means for Jesus to be Lord?
4. How does Scripture define true surrender to Christ?
5. Based on these verses, how can someone examine whether Jesus is truly Lord of their life?

Reflect

- Is Jesus truly Lord of my life, or just someone I listen to?
 - Where am I still trying to stay in control?
 - What would full surrender look like for me right now?
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SECTION 6 — LIVING READY FOR WHAT'S COMING

Focus

Live prepared and ready.

Read

Mark 13:33–37

Respond

1. In Mark 13:33–37, what instructions does Jesus give about being ready?
2. What do these verses reveal about the attitude believers should have toward the future?
3. According to Scripture, what is the difference between being prepared and being fearful?
4. How does knowing God's Word help believers stay ready?
5. What does a life that is ready for Jesus' return look like according to these passages?

Reflect

- Am I living prepared or distracted?
 - If Jesus returned soon, what would need to change?
 - What is one step I can take this week to live more intentionally for Him?
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FINAL ENCOURAGEMENT

God's plan is precise. His Word is trustworthy. And Jesus is the center of it all.

- God declared the Messiah's coming down to the exact day
- Jesus fulfilled prophecy perfectly
- Salvation is a gift—not something we earn
- Jesus must be Lord—not just teacher

If God was that accurate 2,500 years ago, we can trust Him with everything today.

The question is not just what God has done.

The question is:

Is He Lord of my life?

Stay grounded in the Word.

Stay focused on Jesus.

Stay ready for what is coming.
