- I. <u>Crossroads Core Values</u> Things I would teach to build the Church
 - A. We Want To Be With Him His Presence Means Everything
 - B. We Do Life Together Relationships Make Us Stronger
 - C. We Pull on the Leash Big Faith, Big Risks, Big God!
- II. We Live Generously Freely we receive, freely we give.
 - A. Matt 10:1-8
 - 1. Freely dorean Gratuitously, given without cost to the recipient. For nothing
 - 2. <u>Received</u> lambano To take, grab hold of or seize; to come to believe something and act according to that belief.
 - 3. Freely Give didomi To cause to happen, to make or to produce
- III. We Live Generously Core Value Not about a command but rather an invitation
 - A. <u>Generous</u> Webster liberal in giving: openhanded a generous benefactor; marked by abundance or ample proportions
 - B. God's Financial Generosity starts with the tithe Giving God what is His first.
 - 1. Gen 2:15 Where does tithing start? Is it part of the Law?
 - a) Jacob makes a vow 400 yrs before Law
 - (1) Gen 28:22 22...of all that You give me I will surely give a tenth to You.
 - 2. <u>Lev 27:30</u> 30 And all the tithe of the land, whether of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the tree, is the Lord's. It is holy to the Lord.
 - 3. Ex 23:19 19 The first of the firstfruits of your land you shall bring into the house of the Lord your God.
 - a) <u>Firstfruit</u> The first portion of something which has been set aside and offered to God before the rest of the substance or objects can be used.
 - (1) Rom 11:16 16 For if the <u>firstfruit</u> is <u>holy</u>, the <u>lump</u> is also <u>holy</u>; and if the root is holy, so are the branches.
 - b) Prov 3:9-10 9 Honor the Lord with your possessions, And with the firstfruits of all your <u>increase</u>; 10 So your barns will be filled with plenty, And your vats will overflow with new wine.
 - 4. <u>Deut 26:1-2;13-14</u>
 - a) <u>Luke 11:42</u> 42 But woe to you Pharisees! For you tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass by justice and the love of God. <u>These you ought to have done</u>, without leaving the others undone.

IV. 2 Cor 9:5-11 - We Live Generously - "How we give"

- A. Generosity eulogeo To give as to be a blessing.
- B. <u>Grudging obligation</u> pleonexia Extortion; to obtain from a person by force, intimidation
 - 1. Greedy Heart Selfish thoughts are evil. Desire to keep
 - 2. Generous Heart Selfless thoughts are Godly; Called to give generously
- C. <u>Sparingly</u> pheidomenos Restraint; pertaining to what is done in a limited, sparing manner and of negligible quantity or extent.
- D. <u>Bountifully</u> ep eulogiais large amount of something, with the implication of blessing or benefit.
 - 1. <u>Gen 8:22</u> 22 "While the earth remains, Seedtime and harvest, Cold and heat, winter and summer, And day and night Shall not cease."
 - 2. GENEROUS Life Steps:
 - a) Hearing, Excitement, Fear, Logic, Doubt, Faith
- E. <u>Purposes</u> proaireomai to choose for oneself before another thing; to bring forth for one self.
 - 1. <u>Luke 12:34</u> Where your treasure is there your heart will be also.
- F. <u>Grudgingly</u> sad regretful feeling because of what you have given.
 - 1. <u>Grieving Heart</u> Grieving over giving.
- G. <u>Necessity</u> anagke out of obligation, to urge or cause to do by overwhelming pressure.
- H. <u>Cheerful</u> hilaros Prompt or willing, good-natured, joyfully ready. The word describes a spirit of enjoyment in giving that sweeps away all restraints.
- I. <u>Able</u> dunateo Efficient, productive, He will produce
- J. Grace charis Favorable attitude toward someone, to give graciously & generously.
- K. Abound perisseuo To have in excess, abundance as to be more than sufficient
- L. Sufficiency autarkeia Enough, competence, a quantity adequate for a purpose
- M. <u>Supplies</u> epichoregeo To defray expenses, to supply fully or abundantly, generously provide what is needed, to cover the costs completely.
- N. <u>Liberality</u> haplotes Act of generosity, generous
