1. The Blood of Jesus — Paid in Full

- **Main Point:** The blood of Jesus paid for salvation, healing, and deliverance.
 - **Scriptures:**
 - *Isaiah 53:5* — “By His stripes we are healed.”
 - **Quotes:**
 - “Jesus shed His blood so that you can be saved, healed, and delivered.”
 - The atonement covers every area of life: sin, sickness, and spiritual bondage.
 - Christians still sin, get sick, and experience torment—but that doesn’t change what Jesus already paid for.
 - The question isn’t “*Did He pay for it?*” but “*Are we applying it?*”
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2. Misdiagnosis in the Church

- **Main Point:** The church often misdiagnoses spiritual problems as natural or emotional ones.
- “You can’t counsel a demon. You can’t medicate a demon.”
- Medications and therapy can numb the soul, but they don’t remove demonic torment.
- When we numb ourselves to pain, we also become numb to the Holy Spirit.

- The result: many Christians live numb because they're treating symptoms instead of roots.
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3. Our Struggle Is Spiritual

- **Scripture:** *Ephesians 6:12* — “Our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against rulers and powers of this dark world.”
 - We are primarily spiritual beings with a temporary body.
 - The enemy's goal is to steal, kill, and destroy (John 10:10).
 - What matters is not *where* a demon is, but that it's *dealt with*:
 - “If it's stealing, killing, destroying, or tormenting—it's got to go.”
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4. The Door of Access

- **Scriptures:**
 - *James 4:7–8* — “Submit to God, resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”
 - *1 Peter 5:8* — “The enemy prowls like a lion seeking whom he may devour.”
 - Demons look for open doors: sin, lies, wounds, and trauma.
 - When we agree with anger, bitterness, or lies, we give the enemy access.
 - The devil wants to tell you what to feel so he can control how you act.
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5. Jesus' Warning About Empty Houses

- **Scripture:** *Matthew 12:43–45*
 - Jesus describes an evil spirit leaving a “swept clean” house, then returning with seven worse.
- Only believers can have a “swept clean” house—unbelievers can't be cleansed.

- Deliverance must be followed by discipline and discipleship.
 - When believers experience freedom but don't fill their lives with the Word and obedience, the house stays empty and gets reoccupied.
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6. Two Kingdoms at War

- The fight isn't just for you—it's for your marriage, your children, and your grandchildren.
 - Freedom requires perseverance; truth challenges comfort.
 - "You're going to be tempted to leave this church... because truth confronts the enemy in you."
 - Some churches avoid hard truth - this fight is about your family's spiritual inheritance.
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7. Inheritance and the Covenant of Blood

- **Scripture:** *Genesis 17:1–7*
 - God established His covenant with Abraham and his descendants—a generational blessing.
 - Covenant is established by blood.
 - "When blood mixes, it cannot be unmixed."
 - God's design was for blessings to flow through generations like a **spiritual pipe**.
 - "There's a pipe that things are flowing through. You can put living water through it—or you can put poison in it."
 - The problem: many before us have put "doo-doo in the pipe."
 - God created the system to bless families, but the enemy hijacks it to curse them.
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8. Scriptural Proof of Generational Patterns

- **Example:** Abraham lied → Isaac lied → Jacob deceived.
 - **Example:** David struggled with lust → Solomon multiplied it.
 - Patterns increase in intensity through generations.
 - Even secular culture recognizes it: “Hank Williams Jr. said, ‘Why do you drink? Why do you smoke? Because it’s a family tradition.’”
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9. Misused Scriptures About Generational Curses

- **Scriptures often used out of context:**
 - *Ezekiel 18:20* — Refers to physical death under Old Covenant law, not the spiritual inheritance of sin.
 - *Galatians 3:13–14* — Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, not from responsibility to apply His blood.
 - The blood of Jesus gives authority to break every curse, but it must be applied through obedience, repentance, and faith.
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10. Key Truths to Remember

1. **It might not have started with you, but it can end with you.**
 - Generational patterns can stop through repentance and deliverance.
2. **If you don’t face your parents’ demons, your kids will.**
 - Discipline alone isn’t enough—apply the blood of Jesus.
 - *1 Kings 2:5–9* — David tells Solomon that because he didn’t deal with certain enemies, Solomon must.
3. **You break the curse by repenting and renouncing.**
 - Recognize the signs.

- Repent of sin and unbelief.
 - Renounce demonic agreements and vows.
 - Remove the spirit in Jesus' name.
 - Renew your mind through the Word and obedience.
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11. Call to Action

- “You can live your whole life saying, ‘That’s not fair,’ or you can roll up your sleeves and start picking weeds.”
- Freedom requires responsibility.
- Recognize the patterns. Renounce the lies. Remove the enemy. Renew your life.
- “We don’t overcome by the discipline of the body—we overcome by the blood of Jesus Christ.”
- Choose to leave a legacy of faith and freedom for the next generation.
