- A. V1 In the Spirit of the LORD Vision, Spiritual realm experience.
 - 1. John in the Revelation
 - 2. Paul in 2 Cor in the body or out of the body was caught up to 3rd heaven.
- B. V1b-V2 Valley full of bones -
 - 1. <u>Valley</u> Low place <u>Ps 23</u> Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death I will fear no evil.
 - 2. **Bones** Represent death; Things were in disarray, bones were scattered everywhere.
 - 3. **Dry** -
 - a) One Usage from the root word to be ashamed, confused, disappointed, sad, unhappy, unfulfilled, etc.
 - b) Other Usage yabesh dry; lacking moisture(1) Water in scripture represents the Holy Spirit or the Word of God
 - c) **Eph 5:26** 26 that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word,
 - (a) Washing loutron to bath the whole body, immersion,
 - d) **Dry things:** Begin to shrivel, crack and are easily broken.
 - (1) <u>Shrivel</u> Draw or shrink back; Empty of strength or nutrients, exhausted, weakened.

- (2) **Crack** Creates openings where things get in that normally wouldn't penetrate us.
- (3) **Easily broken** They don't bounce back as well as fresh things
- C. <u>V3</u> The Million Dollar Question Can these bones live?
 - 1. This is an irreversible situation naturally.
 - a) It would be one thing if He said, can God prevent them from dying?(1) Ex: Martha and Lazarus
 - (2) John 11:21-27 21 Now Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died. 22 But even now I know that whatever You ask of God, God will give You." 23 Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." 24 Martha said to Him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." 25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. 26 And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" 27 She said to Him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, who is to come into the world."
 - (a) <u>I am</u> eimi (i-mee'); the first person singular present indicative; I exist (used only when emphatic)
 - (b) <u>I believe</u> Don't tell me what you know Martha, tell me what you believe.

- b) **Eph 5:17** 17 Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is.
 - (1) <u>Understand</u> *suniemi* From two words that means to "to bring or put together". To use one's capacity for understanding and arrive at an insight.
 - (2) Wisdom is believing what God says.
